## Session 3– Just Cause: What Causes Matter to You?

Choose one of the following topics:

### Donating – Giving Money

- If you had a limited amount of money to donate, where would you choose to give it?
- What causes feel most important to you right now? (Education, poverty, environment, health, Jewish community, equality, disability inclusion, etc.)
- What influenced that choice? Was it a personal experience, a value?
- Would you prioritize causes in your community or global ones? Why?
- Do you think you should focus on many different causes or one cause?
- Do you think it is a Jewish value to donate to causes that are not necessarily Jewish?

Choose one of the following topics:

### Volunteering – Giving Time

You decided to volunteer 5 hours a week. What kind of volunteer work is most important to you?

- Do you volunteer now? If so, where?
- Why did you decide to volunteer there?
- What kind of contribution feels most meaningful to you: helping individuals directly, working on systemic change, or raising awareness?

- 06** Press "Great! Proceed to payment"

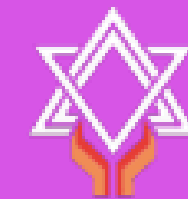

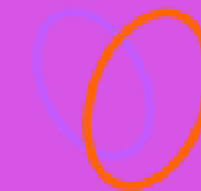
